## THE MESSAGE



We are here to give thanks that Jesus is the Light & that he has blessed each of us & all of us with life, love & connection with each other & with God.

But those gifts have consequences -

if we are blessed & gifted with the light of life, the light of love, the light of Christ, we are called to share that life, to pass that love on, to let that light shine.

The anthem sung by the choir is one way of expressing the meaning of the Sermon on the Mount. The Gospel passage we just heard is the beginning of that summary of the teaching of Jesus. It has been set to music in many ways. This is one of them:

Peter&Anna Blessed are they who are poor in spirit, theirs is the kingdom of God Bless us, O Lord, make us poor in spirit, bless us, O Lord, our God.

We are the **light of the world**, may our **light** shine before all That they may see the good that we do & give glory to God.

Blessed are they who bring peace among us, they are the children of God. Bless us, O Lord, may your peace be with us; bless us, O Lord, our God.

We are the **light of the world**, may our **light** shine before all That they may see the good that we do & give glory to God.

Jesus said - "You are the light of the world!" There is a double meaning here because you can mean one individual, but it can also mean a whole community.

In Greek & Aramaic, the word for you that Jesus used—is plural—like "Y'all" is in the South. But it still applies to each one of us as individuals. So -- is it about me or about us?

......And the answer is - YES - it is about both! Together and as individual disciples We are the light of the world! That is a great reason to give thanks today.

But our thanksgiving is not complete until we do what the anthem sings about —until we walk as Children of the Light. The gift of being Children of the Light is a call to be instruments of peace, -of justice, -of freedom -in our families, communities & the entire world.

We are called to let our light shine by feeding the hungry, visiting the sick and caring for the excluded; by welcoming the stranger & being good stewards of the earth itself. Then, our lives will sing another song:

"If all the world were peaceful now, & forevermore.

Peaceful at the surface & peaceful at the core.

Then all the joy within my heart would be so free to soar.

And we're living on a living planet, circling a living star.

I don't know where we're goin', but I know were goin' far.

And we can change the universe by bein' who we are..."

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Anna In the Gospel reading we heard, Jesus uses the present tense when he says,
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"You ARE the light of the world". It is a gift already given. We do not have a choice about it.

-Our only choice is whether we will let it shine or hide it under a bushel.

And how do we share it? By living the Beatitudes — which are a summary of the entire Gospel They're **not** always easy to **accept**, to **understand** & to **live** 

-but you know what they mean & how to live them, IF you know, the prayer we call the Our Father because...in a way, The Lord's Prayer is the Readers'-Digest-condensed-version of the Beatitudes.

The **Beatitudes** are *-different* facets of **one diamond**, *-different* strands of **one web**—the **Teachings** of **Jesus** .......Which one is your **favorite**? ......Which one **scares** you?

~If I live ONE of the Beatitudes fully, I am probably living the REST as well.

~If you know the Lord's Prayer, you know the Beatitudes

~ If you understand & are living the Lord's Prayer, you are living the Beatitudes.

How do we live as the Children of God we are? —We are compassionate —We put God & others first.

We admit that we need God in our lives, & we need each other to follow God's call.

We let the attitudes of Jesus (described in the beatitudes) transform who we are & what we do.

We live conscious that every person, every thing, every minute we have in our lives is GIFT.

Some businesses are even realizing that living these attitudes are not only good for people, they are good for business as well.

Living these values could be the best way to save humanity & the earth itself.

The end of the Gospel reading is about our call to be SAINTS,

-those who lived as Jesus did to be the Light of the World.

Once we meet Jesus at the **WELL of BAPTISM** & have been invited to become His Disciples,

we no longer have a choice if we will share the LIFE & LIGHT we received. Our only choice is 'How' will I do it?

Today we would say we're called to recognize how we've been gifted 0 to now it forward

As Jesus said in his 1st sermonat Nazareth "You are sent to bring glad tidings to be ministers of our God witnesses of the Gospel!"

We are ALL called to be **evangelists** — someone who makes a **verb** of the **"Good News"** the **Gospel** → the Beatitudes

That's how we live as an **evangelist** someone who "**GoodNews-es**" others ~ who lives the way Jesus did as a **Child of Light**
