      "How can we live the Gospel / with our brothers & sisters around the world/
             they discerned to share Jesus' love for the life of the "world" -with the people of Peru.
And over 25 yrs. ago/the Bishop asked the sisters who were in Peru/
       to establish a small parish / at the edge of the town of Sicuani. / in the southern Andes Mountains/
                     -11,000 feet [over 2 miles] above sea level /— a 2 day journey up from Lima /
Presently / Sr. Eileen administers the parish there / with Sr Ancilla /& Sr Norma [one of our Peruvian Sisters]./
       When the sisters first arrived they noticed that many parents from the outlying Andean communities
              rented a room in town/so that their sons could stay during the week/& go to high school nearby./
since No girls were included in the plan, the Srs secured grant money to purchase a house & furniture
       so the girls could stay with the sisters during the week/& also enroll in the secondary school.
Each girl pays the equivalent of $7.00 a month, but no one is refused if that amount is too much.
                                                        of course/it really doesn't cover the whole cost./
Once a year each of the boarders gets a turn to donate "standing meat"
                        -a lamb/to provide meat twice a week for all of them./
   Other things are also purchased in the market/to supplement the girls' diet/
The girls go home on Fri & most return on Sun. /Some walk 5 hours each way/
                                                                                    to get an education.
On Sat afternoons, teenagers help with the children's catechesis in the various neighborhoods of the parish.
                                          usually they are 7th Bth graders/who work with the younger children./
Most adults there are not accustomed to weekly liturgies because in the small Andean villages they came from
  Mass was celebrated only once a year./Consequently, those at Sat evening Mass/are mostly children [& dogs]./
who come early for Sat Mass/to play in the meeting room where the sisters have 'LEGOS'. / When Sr. Eileen
returns to Peru from a visit to the U.S., /her suitcase is actually only 1/2 full of clothes —most is legos, games & such./
Since most adults don't go to Mass/Eileen also shares scriptures in church/ with the police every Monday/
before they go to work for the week. / Once /they had an especially hard job /ahead of them, so they asked/

During this awful Coronavirus pandemic, many Peruvians felt bad they couldn't participate in the Holy Week processions.
The Archbishop of Lima told them they were personally living the Passion of Christ in their lives
               as they were restricted /in so many ways of choosing where they go /& what they do./
                                                      as well as seeing so many of their people suffer & die. /
 Usually, we're at early morning mass/in Sicuani but now/
               there's been a longer time /to pray & meditate by the window in my room. /
Each day, /I observe the poor people /who receive meals /from the soup kitchen /
pushing & pulling the carts/that collect the garbage in our town,/taking it to a central place/where a truck picks it up./
               They begin work at 3am/ & are required to participate this way/ if they want to be fed. /
                                                     To me, / it's a modern example / of carrying one's cross. /
Other people from the Andean communities/walk by,/carrying heavy loads/of corn or/potatoes or/even slaughtered sheep/
               on their backs/ to sell in the market/ & then return home, / lugging supplies they'd bought in town./
Normally trucks/ would take them back to their villages, but now no traffic is allowed /
                                                                     —another way of the cross for them.
 We've had a better than average/corn & lima bean harvest/from our garden this year/
                                                     & we are sharing some/ with the poor families we know./
       A few weeks ago, / Ancilla saw 4 police /standing on the corner/
                               & went over to ask permission /to take out the car /to make food deliveries. /
               Ancilla gave them each /a chocolate bar, /saying "Don't throw the wrapper in the street." /
                                      They laughed & replied, /"Yes, Sister." A little humor goes a long way!
 At the end of Lent, Ancilla had the idea to hang pictures of the Stations of the Cross on the outside wall of our house.
      Norma got a ladder/& hung them high enough/to be out of reach/but one night/someone lifted the 5<sup>th</sup> station./
We tried/to put a charitable interpretation/on the thievery,/saying maybe/the person was inspired/by Simon's kindness,/
                         or worse yet, they needed some kindling to start the fire to cook breakfast.
I was able to do a new one/& all stayed intact/for Good Friday./
                         Currently there's an Alleluia banner /hanging out the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor window/ to celebrate Easter.
 We're able to tune into mass on Facebook after a few glitches in the beginning.
       At 1<sup>st</sup> /images on the laptop /were sideways. /
               Rather than lie on the floor /to get a better perspective, /we closed our eyes /& just listened. /
    Other masses from /Toronto & South Dakota came through /hut, /now we can tune in locally. /
 At 5pm we play cards /--at 6pm mass on line /& dinner at 7pm. / --With lots of corn & lima beans --we're being creative.
For fear of the church alter wine/turning into vinegar,/we took it down to the house/& use it now & then for a night cap./
We visited families/again last week,& felt terrible/that a crippled woman & her 3 children/hadn't eaten in 3 days./
I called CARITAS/asking if they could help with some staples. They arrived within an hour/with a pick up truck & extra food.
  Some other passing women, asked if their families could also be included in the food distribution.
           It was a modern day experience of the multiplication of the loaves & fishes.
